K-14 is an educational model that incorporates Roane County's post-secondary institutions (Roane State and TCAT) into public high school career pathways that enable students to graduate high school with a college degree or certificate.





K-14 School Programming



The New Facility Would Be Comprised of Space at This %:

- » General Academic 21%
- Shared Core 21%
- Career & Technical Ed (CTE)– 18%
- >> Health and Wellness 14%
- >> Team Sports 8%

- >> Assembly 6%
- \rightarrow Arts 7%
- ➤ Building Support 3%
- >> Collaboration 2%

- CTE includes RSCC and TCAT partnerships
- No other school in TN includes all of these opportunities
- Changeable "flex" space to meet rapidly changing needs


A K-14 School in Roane County would include:

- » Opportunity for all students to participate in:
 - >> Dual enrollment at RSCC
 - >> Dual enrollment at TCAT
 - Middle College/Early College at RSCC
 - Middle TCAT
 - >> Students would graduate with at least 4 college classes
 - Every Roane County student would have greater opportunity to attain a college credential earlier than every other student in neighboring communities

Effects of Population Decline:

- Labor shortage
- Increase in crime
- Out-migration of talent
- Aging population
- Business closings/ Layoffs

- Decrease in property values
- Decreased tax base
- Decrease in government services
- Decline in public facilities
- Much more challenging to attract large employers

Solutions

Funding/Timing

- School Plan will cost \$50M estimated to at \$2.9M annually
- In 2023, 14.5 cents of county debt is retired.
- A new school can contribute savings to the debt service,
- The principal on the new loan doesn't begin payment until 2023
- To begin construction and open the new school by Fall 2021, \$3M needs to be raised to pay the interest on new debt until 2023

Solutions



Property/Site Selection

- Partnerships with RSCC and TCAT make adjacent property to RSCC appealing
- The land is available and should not be a deterrent to the progress of the project
- Cost of land will be factored into the project cost, or the land could be donated by the Tennessee Board Regents





Solutions



Historical County Division

- A K-14 new school would far surpass anything we are able to offer our students now
- The new school would help overcome decades of division between relatively small communities
- The comprehensive plan preserves Oliver Springs as a STEAM focused school and Midway whose focus is TBD
- Each of the 3 schools would offer something different and specialized







Solutions



Public Misinformation

- Accurate information from the School Board, County Commission, Roane State and TCAT will be shared by the Roane Chamber throughout the entire process
- A multi-platform educational campaign will work to inform the public why this plan is critical to the future of Roane County
- The campaign will include website, social media, hard copy promotional cards and FAQ's, and in-person presentations








Drug Overdose Deaths/100,000

The overdose mortality rate due to drug overdose in Roane County is MORE THAN DOUBLE the state average







What Is at Stake?

- CDC lists Roane County as the 5th highest county in Tennessee for drug overdose death rate, higher than any state average in the country
- The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation ranks Roane County 65th out of 95 counties for Overall Health Outcomes









What Is at Stake?

Drug Related Crime

Total arrests have increased only 4.4%
Drug related arrests have increased 75.9% in 6 years

Research shows:

"... targeting illicit drug use with an effective treatment or prevention program may be an efficient way to improve educational attainment...public policies that are effective in reducing substance use during high school should have some impact on educational attainment"- Chatterji, 2003, National Bureau of Economic Research

"... increasing cannabis use in late adolescence and early adulthood is associated with...poorer educational outcomes, lower income, greater welfare dependence and unemployment"- Ferguson and Boden, 2008, Addiction, Society for the Study of Addiction





How Does This Relate to Schools? \mathbf{K}^{14}

Research shows:

"... At the school level, academic failure/low educational attainment was associated with high school student NMUPD (non-medical use of prescription drugs)"- Nargiso et al., 2015, Journal on Studies of Alcohol and Drugs

- A new K-14 school in Roane County would rank 51st in state- 1509 students
- 10 schools larger within a one hour drive









5 Schools with inefficient structures

- Reducing to 3 facilities with one state of the art, modern, energy efficient design
- Streamlining of personnel, administration, and purchasing

School shootings
