
#### Prayer

#### **DMST** is considered the most under-reported, most under-identified, and most extreme form of commercial sexual exploitation facing children today.



## Why Sex Trafficking?

- International revenue surpasses \$40 billion/year
- It is the fastest-growing business of organized crime in the world
- Second-largest criminal enterprise in the world
- Easier to conceal than weapons
- A pimp can make \$150,000-\$200,000 per child each year and exploits an average of 4-6 girls







# PORN: the big problem

# Pictures > Videos > Prostitutes > Children

(i.e. Sex, creating Child porn, watching kids watch porn, watching child rape)

#### Also:

- Any instance in which the individual on screen was forced, tricked, or pressured would be considered trafficking
- So, MANY participants in porn are actually being trafficked
- MANY participants in porn are addicted to drugs (coercion)
- MANY participants in porn are actually UNDERAGE GIRLS or BOYS
- ALL Child porn is sex trafficking
- Not all porn is non-consensual, but some of it is and some of it isn't, and when you watch it there's no way to know which is which

## Who are the victims?

- ANYONE WHO IS VULNERABLE
- Any socio-economic status
- Any children or youth
- LGBTQ Youth
- Ethnic Minorities
- Those with high ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences)
- Drug Users
- Anyone with history of sexual or physical abuse
- "Runaway" and "Throwaway" youth populations
- 60% of kids at risk of CSEC fall in this category
- Those whom have been through the foster care/welfare system



50-90% of CSEC victims have been involved in child welfare system



# Who are the perpetrators?

Strangers, family members, friends, pastors, school mates

Those who buy: Johns, Buyers

### Those who sell:

- **Spotter** identifies a prospect
- **Recruiter** gleans information
- **Trafficker** pimp, sells the product
- Gorilla-force physically/emotionally abusive, kidnapping, use of drugs/alcohol
- Romeo declares love, lavishes gifts, promises






#### GROOMING → FORCE + FRAUD + COERCION

- **Utilize Others:** bottom girls, madams, peers or relatives to recruit
- Instability creates
   opportunities for traffickers
   to reach out and bond
   with vulnerable children
- Offers to provide whatever is missing teens life + Exploit vulnerabilities

# Youth and Technology: The Problem

## Predators seek youth who:

- Vulnerable to seduction, including those with histories of sexual or physical abuse
- Post sexually provocative photos/videos online
- Talk about sex with unknown people online
- Post comments about being neglected or unloved, or "their parents just don't understand"
- **OVERSHARE** information



### Recruitment

# Grooming + Coercion = Attachment

- Convince victims they love them
- Isolate victims from family, friends + school
- Manipulates victim to believe if they don't work, harm will come to them or their friends or family
- Violence, fear, intimidation harm can be physical, psychological, financial or reputation
- Methodically strip away self-esteem + assert total control to sleep how to walk, talk, what to wear, eat, when and where
- Drug addiction Get victim addicted to drugs to increase dependence
- Re-name victim, erase former identity
- lake legal documents

### Why don't the victims CEAVE?

- Dependency/Trauma Bonds/Stockholm Syndrome tratticker physically, tinancially or emotionally dependent on the
- Trained to protect pimp using lies and false stories
- Taught to distrust service providers & law enforcement
- Belief that the captors (pimps, madams, johns) can and will kill you
- Captivity, confinement, isolation
- Frequently moved place to place
- Legal documents taken away
- Addicted to drugs
- Fear, shame, self-blame and hopelessness



## How Do We Respond?

## Know the Signs:

- Suddenly withdraws or seeks isolation
- Carries a lot of cash
- Maintains poor personal hygiene
- Dresses inappropriately for weather or setting
- Resists being truthful or open
- Sustains bruises or unexplained injuries
- Dates a much older person
- Chronic runaway
- Homelessness
- Previous sexual abuse

- Misses normal activities with unexplained absence
- Substance abuse disorder
- Distinctive tattoos or branding mark
- Unexplained sudden increase in money, clothing, or other goods
- Fiercely protective over cell phone
- Inconsistency when describing or recounting events
- Frequent school absences and/or drop in grades
- Signs of emotional distress:
   depression, anxiety, parano

depression, anxiety, paranoia, withdrawn behavior, Inability or fear of social interaction

### Identify & Report Perpetrators

# Get help if you recognize any of these characteristics:

- Hyper-jealous, controlling or exhibits violence
- Hiding a relationship with someone significantly older than the teen involved
- Separating person from usual network
- Promising things that are too good to be true
- Suggests they know how to help teen make a lot of money
- Buys expensive gifts without evidence of a 'real' job

## Reporting Child Trafficking

### Where there is immediate danger Call 911

- If you believe you have identified a victim of human trafficking or sexual exploitation, DO NOT intervene as this could put the victim in
- Memorize as many details as you can (i.e. approximate age of victim, license plate number, etc.). height, hair color, any distinct marks on body, location you saw victim,
- Write down any suspicious activity or signs you identified (i.e. marks on body, abnormal behavior, conversations, etc.)

- Trauma informed care
- Also, basic needs
- Food, clothing, shelter
- Job training
- Schooling Recovery credit, GED, etc.
- Social skills
